Tom O'Loughlin is Professor of Historical Theology at the University of Nottingham in England. He is the author of numerous works, including the *Didache: a window on the earliest Christians*, *The Eucharist: Origins and Contemporary Understandings* and *Eating Together, Becoming One*.



Diarmuid O'Murchu is a member of the Sacred Heart Missionary Order, and a graduate of Trinity College, Dublin Ireland, is a social psychologist most of whose working life has been in social ministry, predominantly in London, UK.

His best known books include *Quantum Theology* (1996 - revised in 2004), *Ancestral Grace* (2008), *Jesus in the Power of Poetry* (2009), *Christianity's Dangerous Memory* (2011), *In the Beginning was the Spirit* (2012), *Incarnation: A New Evolutionary Threshold* (2017), *Beyond Original Sin: Recovering Humanity's Creative Urge* (2018), *When the Disciple Comes of Age* (2019) and *Doing Theology in an Evolutionary Way* (due for release in March 2021).
