ROADWORKS I am sure we all agree that the roadworks outside our drive are very inconvenient. While essential work must be carried out, very often there is no-one working there at all. We were given no warning at all of these roadworks – no communication at all, even though the contractors use our grounds for parking without seeking any kind of permission. I, Deacon Douglas and others have sent letters of complaint. This is Scottish Power's response:

I have investigated your concerns with our engineers and I want to go over some details about what these works are. Unfortunately, these were not Planned works, but instead fault works, that is to say Unplanned so in these instances we are unable to prewarn customers. Our engineers are replacing and modernising cabling on the Low Voltage Underground Cable Network and will need to complete a 50m cable overlay in the coming weeks. This work was raised under Emergency Road Opening Notices with the local council however due to the complexity of the works being carried out we have had to extend this to 29 September 2023.

GLORIA IN EXCELSIS DEO This hymn dates from the earliest days of the Church and is there in all the liturgical rites. The musical version of the Latin text, which we occasionally sing, dates from the 13th century. The present English version dates from 2011. When reciting or singing this hymn, we are connected with the whole Church and generations who have gone before us.
