PARISH ACCOUNTS Copies of the 2023 parish accounts are available in the porch. This year we have a reasonable surplus. We have paid substantial four-figure sums to SCIAF (£2221) and Mary's Meals (£5871). Looking ahead, we will have to pay about £19,000 to the diocese, being our share of the assessments; in the grounds a large tree is now becoming dangerous and will have to be felled with the Council's permission (about £4,000 plus); in the house the kitchen is now in a state of genteel decline, and some bathroom fittings are showing their age.
