**ASSISTED SUICIDE** Copies of a pastoral letter from the Scottish Bishops are available in the porch. Assisted suicide is legal in Belgium, the Netherlands, Canada and the state of Oregon. In all these places, there are horrific stories emerging. Basically, whatever promises are made, there are no safeguards – these are often disregarded. And there is tremendous pressure on sick and elderly people simply to end it all.

The Scottish Parliament Health Committee is asking for your views on proposals to legalise assisted suicide in Scotland. It is vital that as many people as possible complete the short survey, which should take just a few minutes to do, before it closes on 16th August. KNITTING FOR UKRAINE If you are a knitter, you might be able to help with a project to knit stump socks for people in Ukraine who have had limbs amputated after being injured in the fighting or bombing. Members of St Michael's Parish Church are in contact with a charity based in the New Forest who send supplies to two hospitals there. The stump socks knitted in Linlithgow would be sent by the charity to those hospitals. There is a pattern which can be adapted for different sizes as children and young people are among the amputees. The wool needs to be very soft so baby wool, 2 or 3 ply, is recommended.
