Readings this Sunday

Joshua 24:1-2, 15-18 *The people are faced with a choice of being faithful to the God of Israel or serving other gods. It is the same choice faced by the apostles in the Gospel and we are faced with that choice every day.*

Response *Taste and see that the Lord is good.*

Ephesians 5: 21-32 *This reading has to be put into the context of the society of the time, which was a patriarchal one. But there is also revolutionary teaching hidden away here. In the society of the time, when women got married they were seen as joining their husband's family. But here, quoting Jesus and the Book of Genesis, it is said that when a man gets married he leaves his family to be joined to his wife in a whole new set-up. Wives are thus equal to their husbands*

John 6: 60-69 *Jesus fails to convince most of his followers about the Eucharist. Even so, the Twelve, headed by Peter, decide to remain faithful to him.*
